## 2. SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS

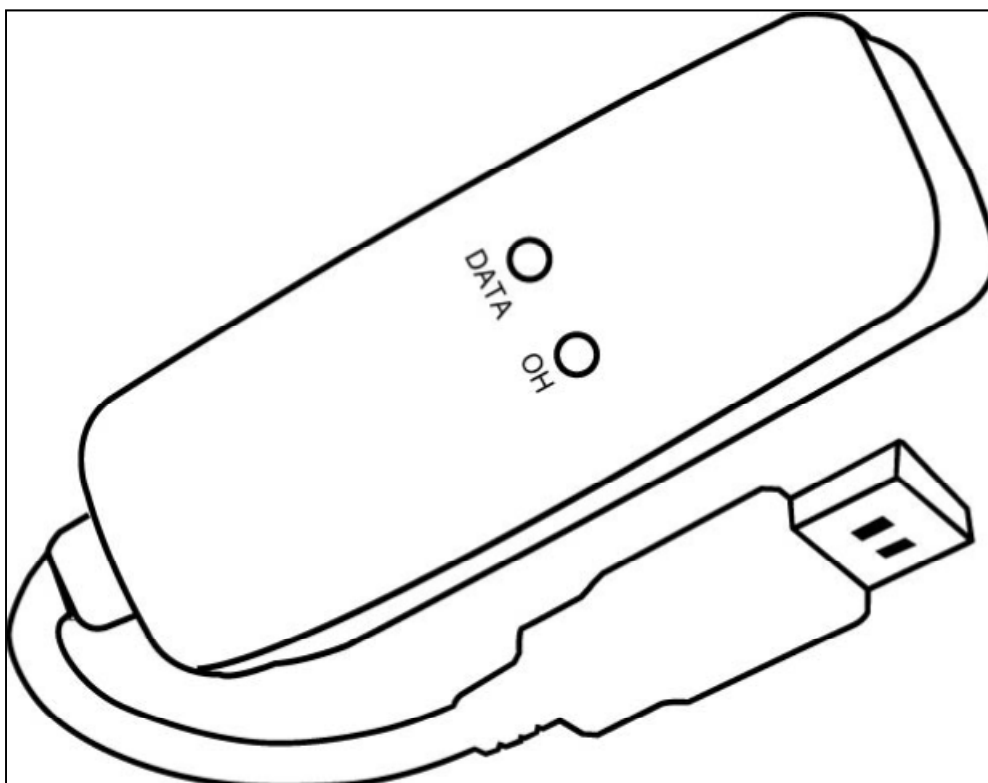
- Pentium II Compatible Processor or Faster
- Minimum 64MB RAM and 20MB Hard Disk free space or more
- Windows XP, Vista, 7, 8
- CD-ROM Drive (for driver installation)
- An available USB port
- Internet Access Requires Dial-up Internet Access Service
- Sound Card For Voice Functions

## 3. LED INDICATORS

There are two LED indicators on your modem identifying the status of operation of the modem.

The following is a brief description of the LED's functions:

DATA	LED Indicator for Data/Ready. This LED will light up when the modem is properly installed.
OH	"On Hold". This LED indicator will light up when the modem is operating . It indicates that the modem can't accept further operational commands.



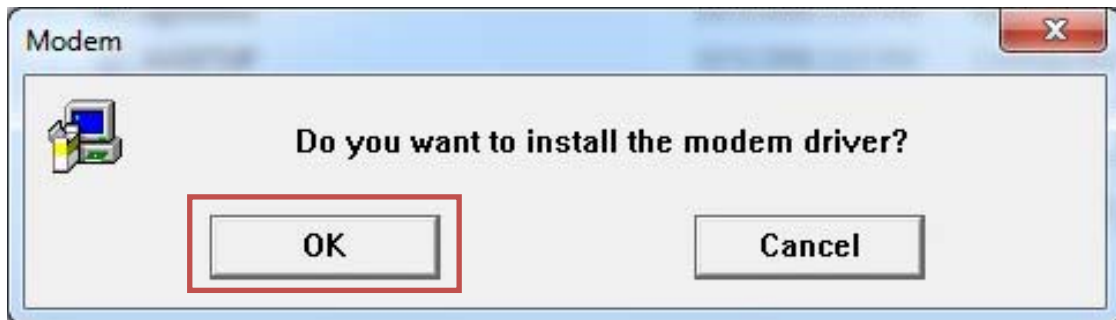
## 4. INSTALLATION

To properly install your new USB modem, please follow the instructions below:

1. Insert the Driver CD into your CD-ROM then Click **"Driver Installation"**.

Notes: The **"USB 56K V.92 Modem"** driver installation screen will start automatically.

2. Choose your operating system to start the installation program.
3. Click ok to complete the installation program.

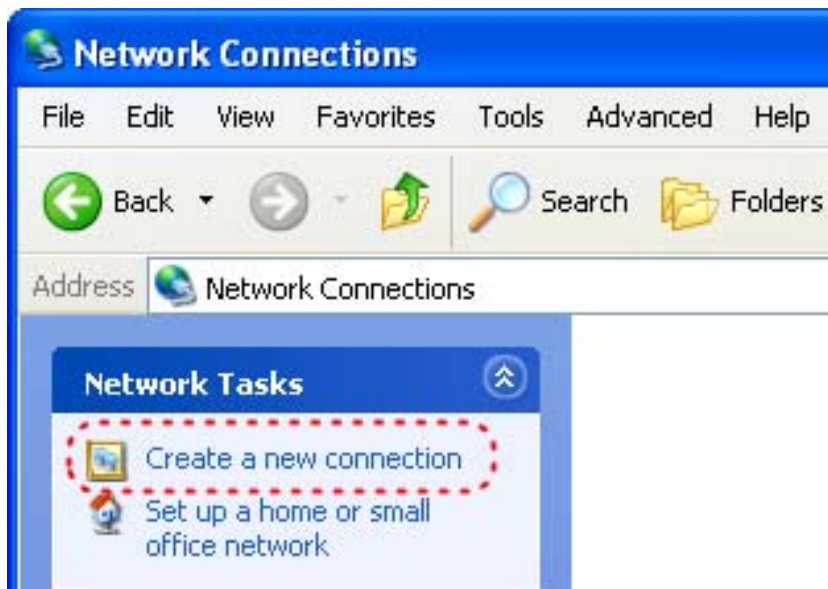


4. After Setup is complete, insert the USB 56k v.92 modem.
5. The operating system will automatically complete the driver installation.

## 5. Manual Dial-up Connection Settings

### A. For example : XP

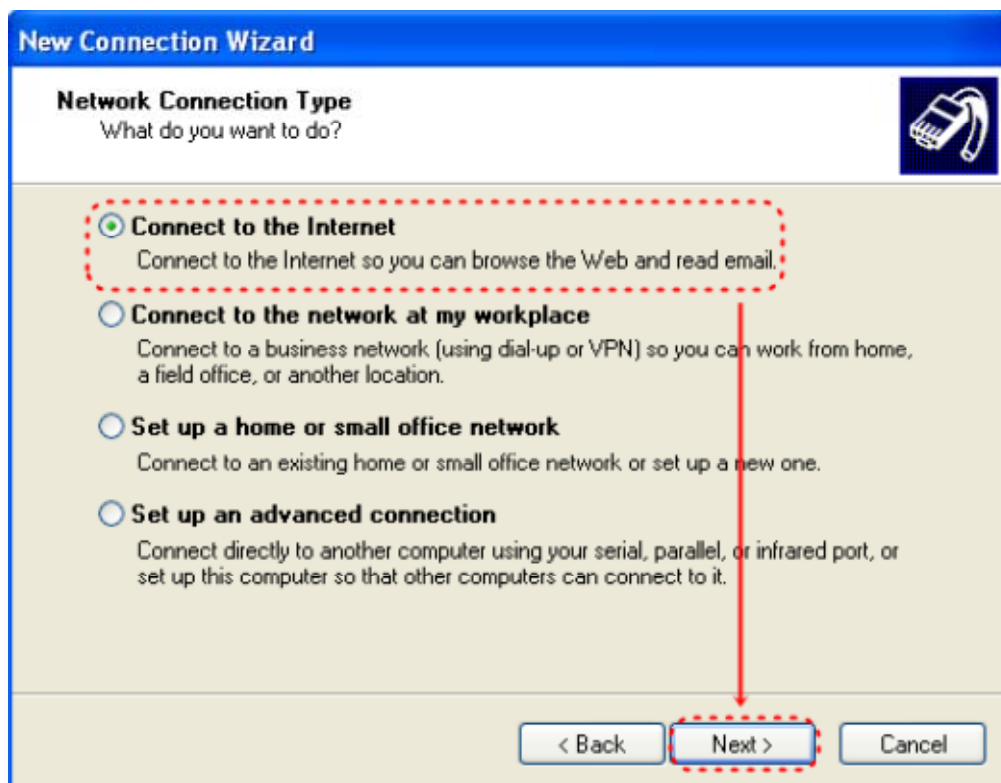
1. On **Control Panel/Network Connections**, click **Create a new connection**.



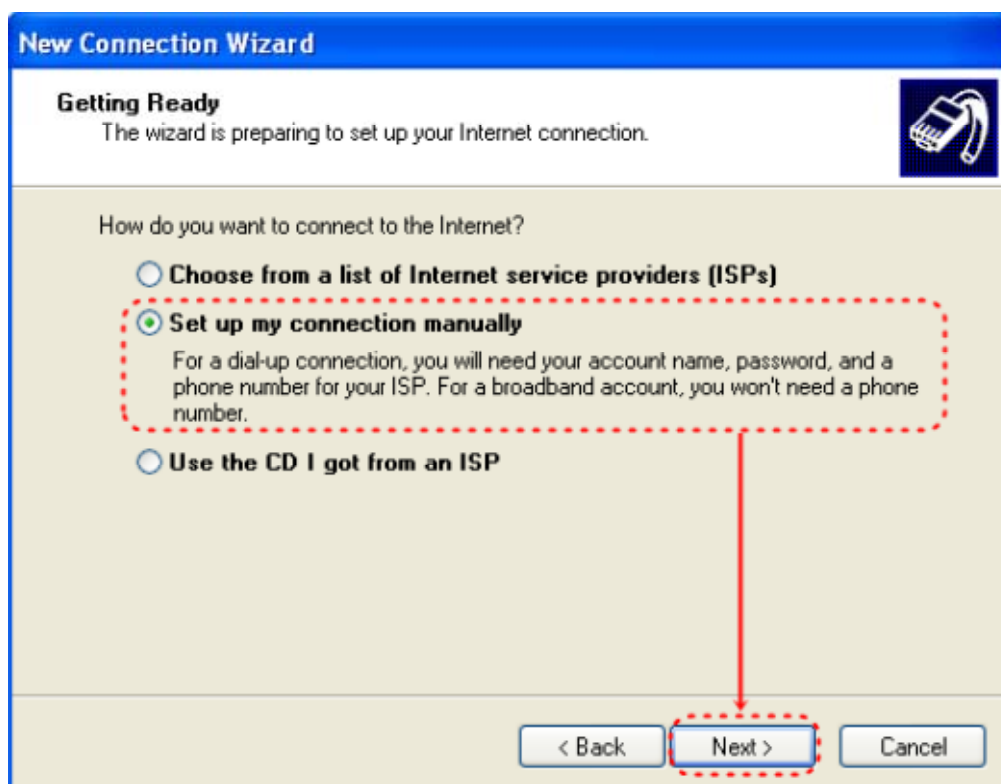
2. Click **Next**.




3. Select **Connect to the Internet** and click **Next**.



4. Select **Set up my connection manually** and click **Next**.



5. Select **Connect using a dial-up modem** and click **Next**.


☒ **Connect using a dial-up modem**

☐ **Connect using a broadband connection that is always on**  
This is a high-speed connection using either a cable modem, DSL or LAN connection. It is always active, and doesn't require you to sign in.





8. Input **User name**, **Password** and **Confirm password**.



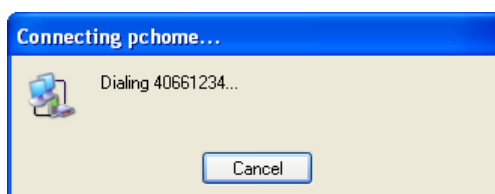

9. Click **Finish** to complete manual connection.

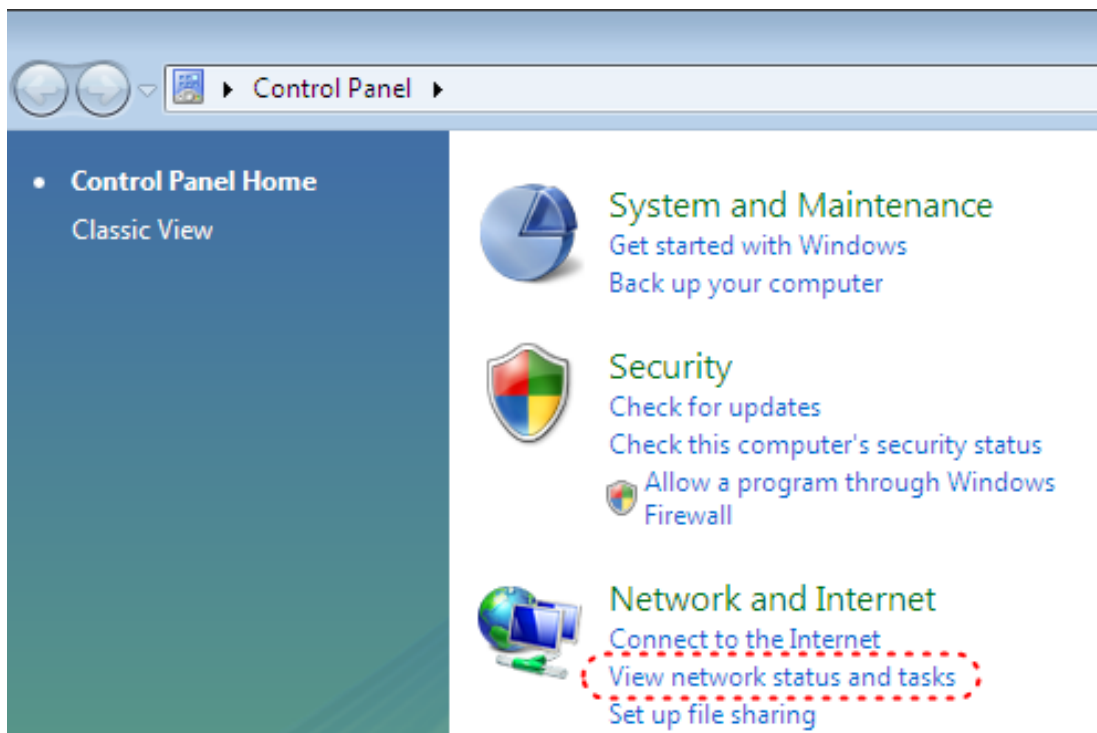


10. Click **Dial** to connect to Internet.

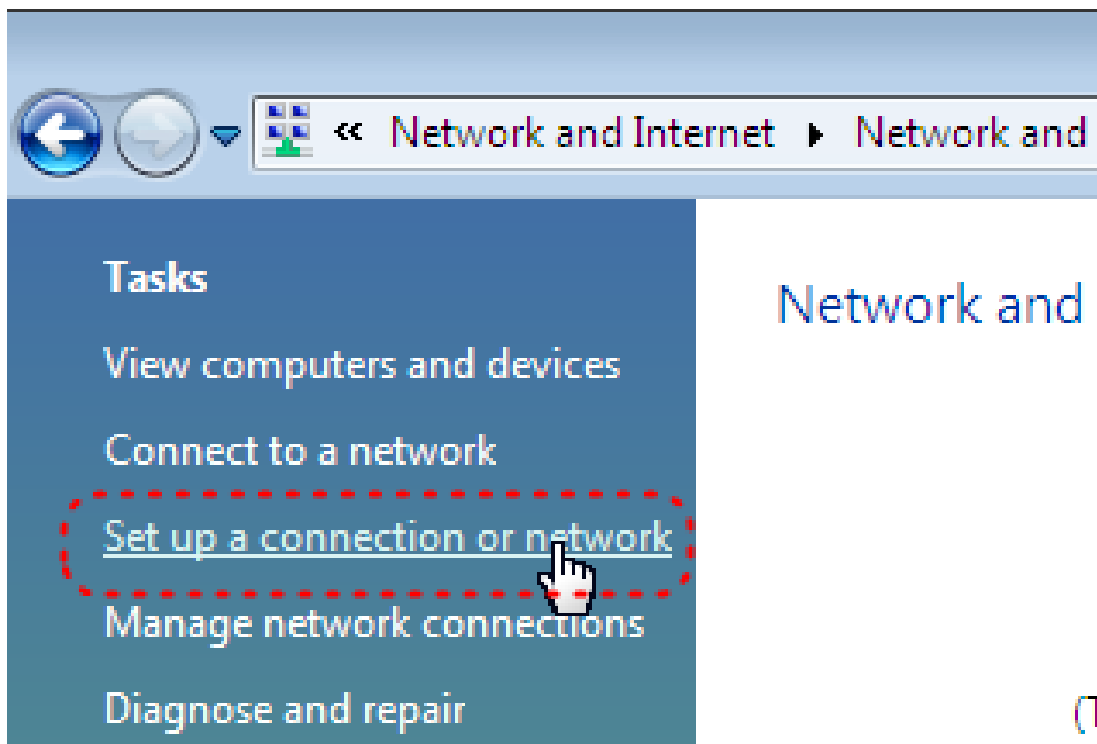


## B. For example : Vista & 7 & 8

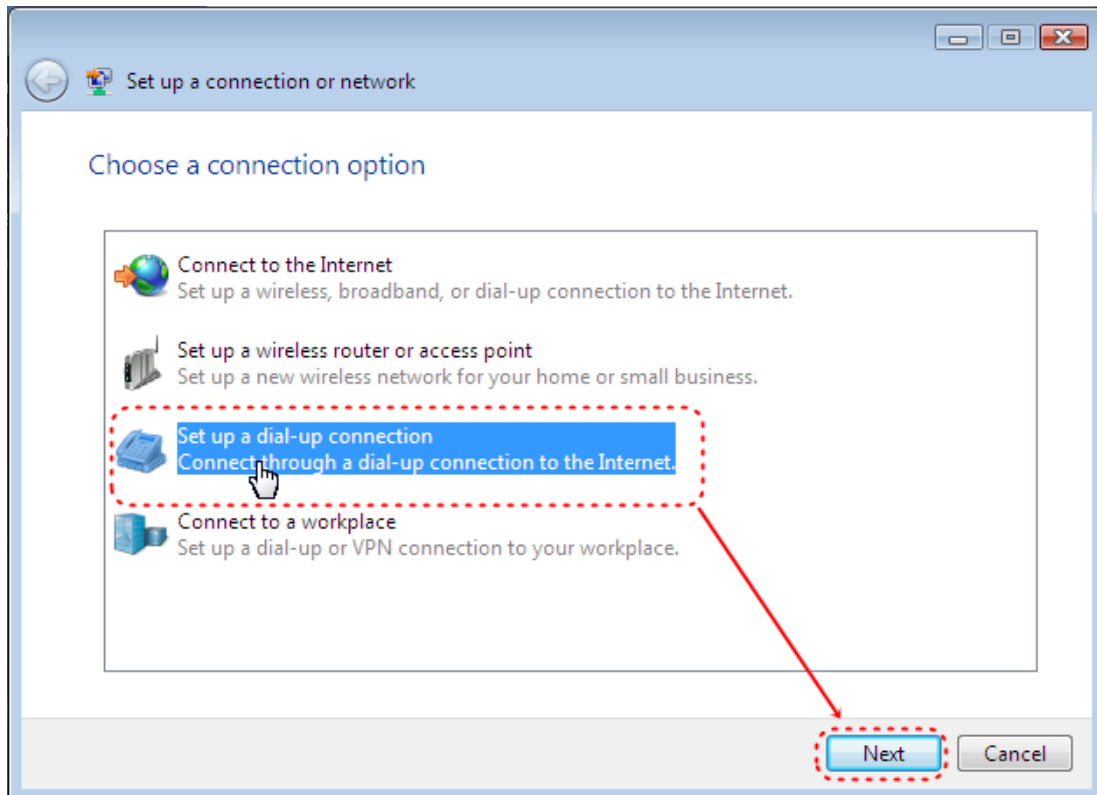
1. Open Control Panel and click **view network status and tasks**.



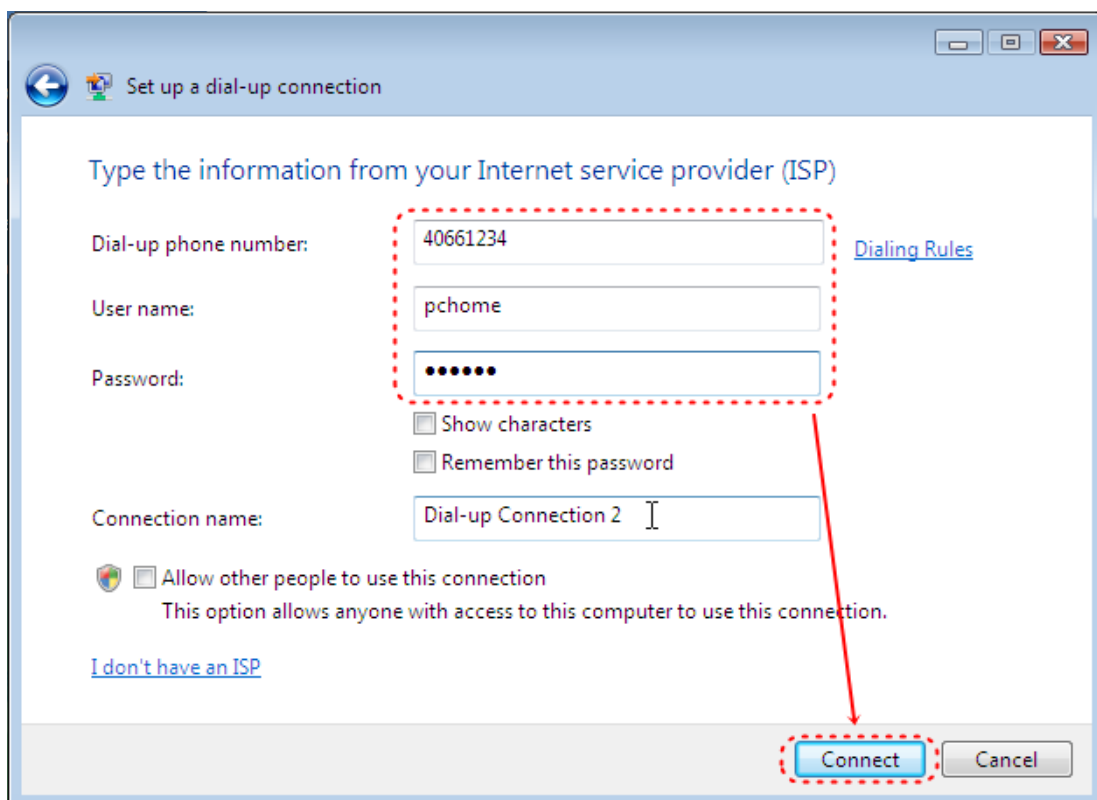
2. Click **Set up a connection or network**.



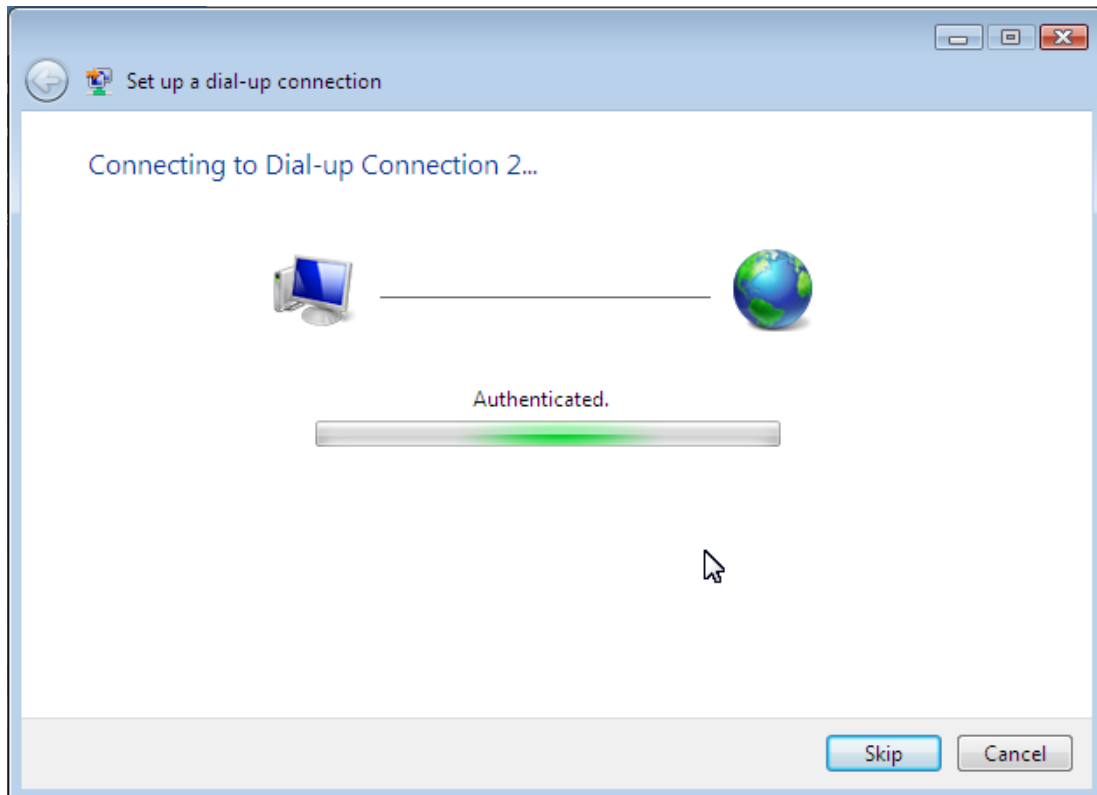
3. Select **Set up a dial-up connection** then click **Next**.
